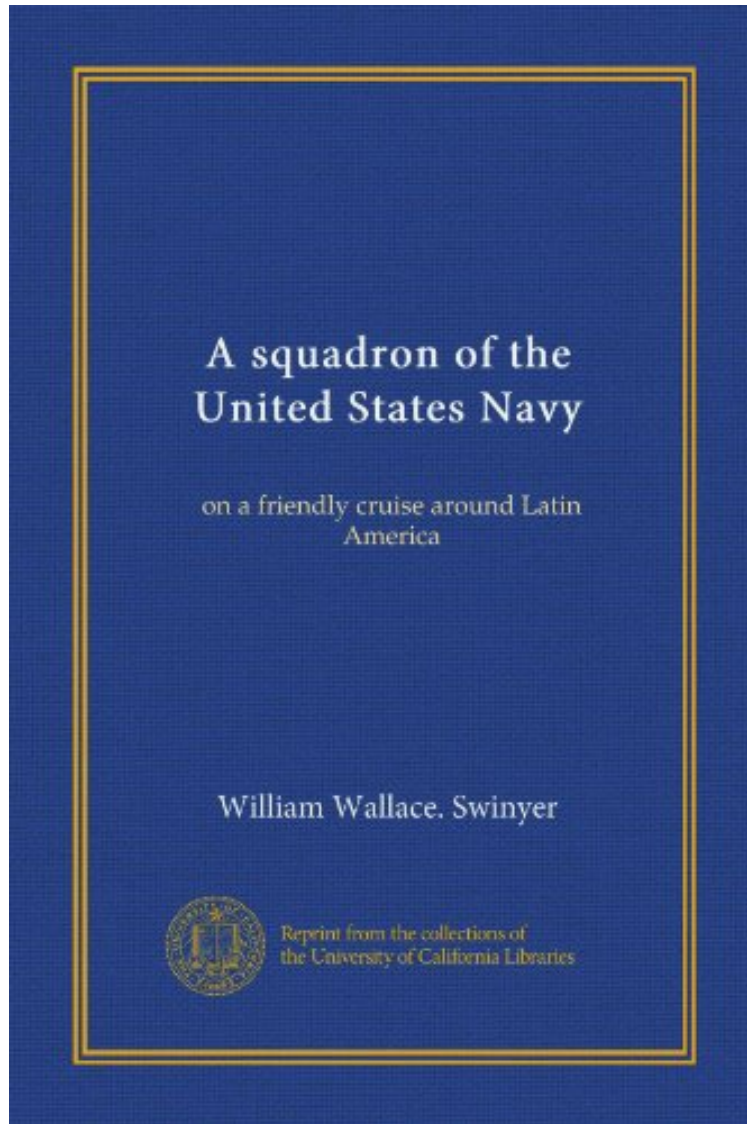

It is written in the style of lay military journalists in the period 1898-1913. The content of the information

varies and the material is a sort of travelogue. Some interesting and historic photographs are included in the book along with some table of the officers of the United States Navy accurate through approximately 1917-1918. One of the persons mentioned in the book is a Commander Z. E. Brooks who eventually received a promotion to Captain and was one of the Commanding Officers of "USS America," a commandeered German luxury liner which became a Navy troop transport ship during WW I and later became a USAT ship. Briggs eventually was a Commanding Officer of the Philippine Division
