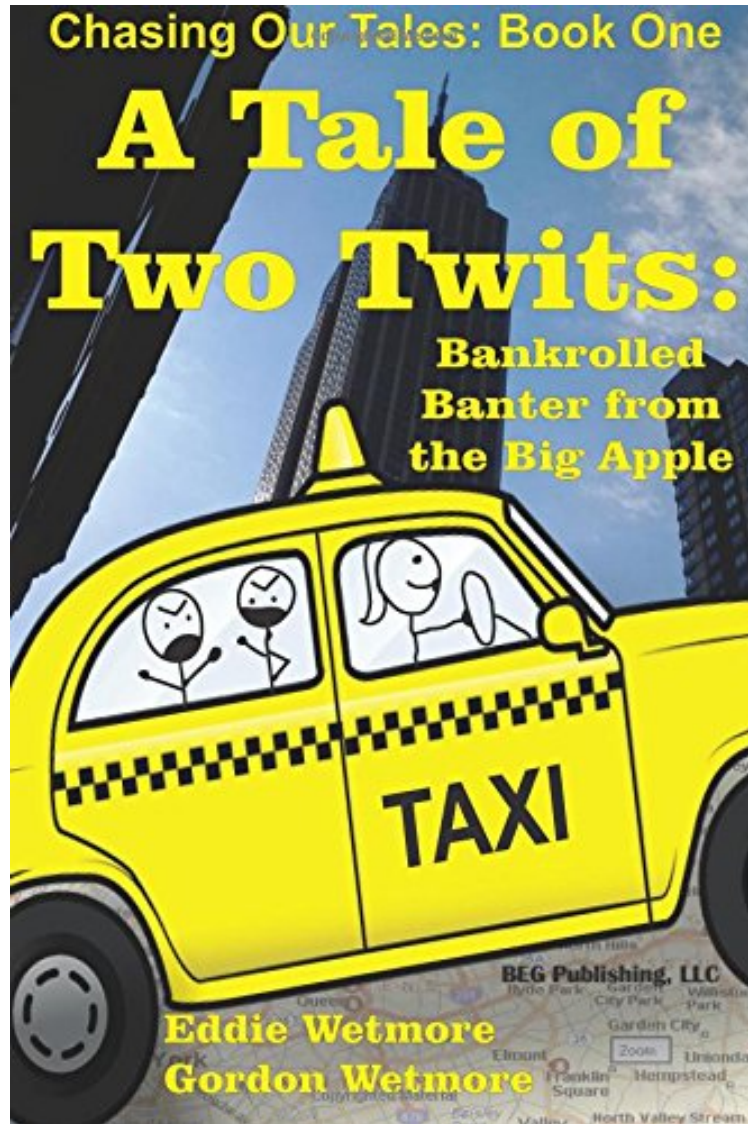

Patrick NelsonI don't typically read, let alone buy, this kind of literature ... most often what I peruse and/or buy I mentally shred to learn better how to tell a story, weave a plot, etc. I can't even watch a movie without the scrutineer mindset ... but I thought, "Anything titled by its writer as identifying himself as a 'Twit' is worth looking into." Besides, I couldn't help seeing these three holding cardboard pieces with crayon writing in the air, "Please ... buy our book ... Help us get home!"Sure enough, this piece is full of constant narration and remarks that sometimes leave you wondering, "Is the writer ... or writers as it may be ... sane, drunk, worse?" Following this trio in an apparent real-to-life foray into New York is sometimes to oft-times nerve-wracking, mind-addling, preposterous, borderline insane (or maybe not so borderline), off the wall (although I think, barely hanging onto it), off-key, irreverent, jaw-dropping unexpected (imagine a ten-year-old boy yelling out, "Thank you for the good time," to a priest or minister in a church service, no matter how innocent it may be), bumbling, but out-right witty.
