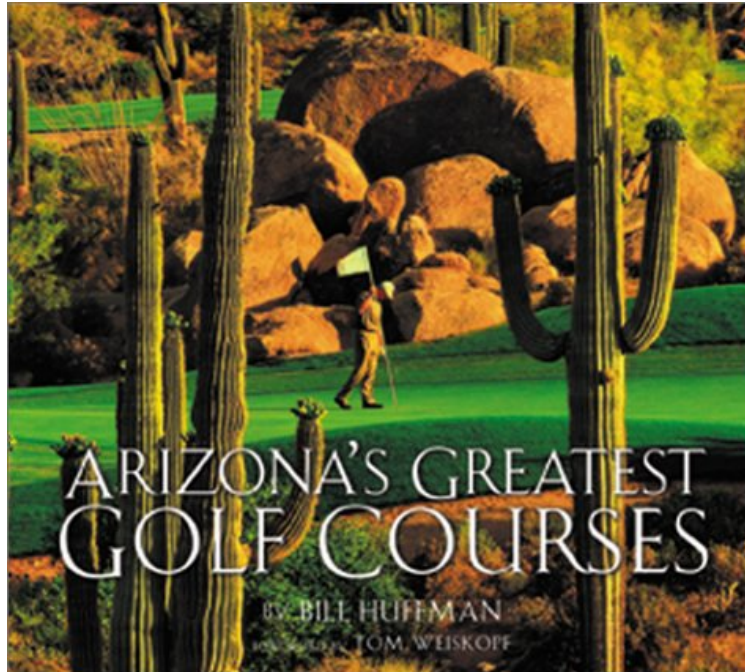

What I got was of the history behind some Arizona courses- who designed them, how design decisions were made, and other historical trivia. There is very little attention given to how each course plays, the amenities, or the conditions. There are a couple of descriptions of a few holes, but very little depth. The stories are somewhat interesting, and the photos are beautiful, but overall it does not deliver what golfers most likely expect.

In this book describing Arizona's greatest public, resort and private golf courses, former golf writer for The Arizona Republic,Bill Huffman,has written an interesting history of golf in Arizona. If one reads carefully his selections, an anthology develops . Each course section features excellent photography and descriptions of the course, its founders and tidbits the average golfer would never know from reading other publications.As a frequent winter visitor and
