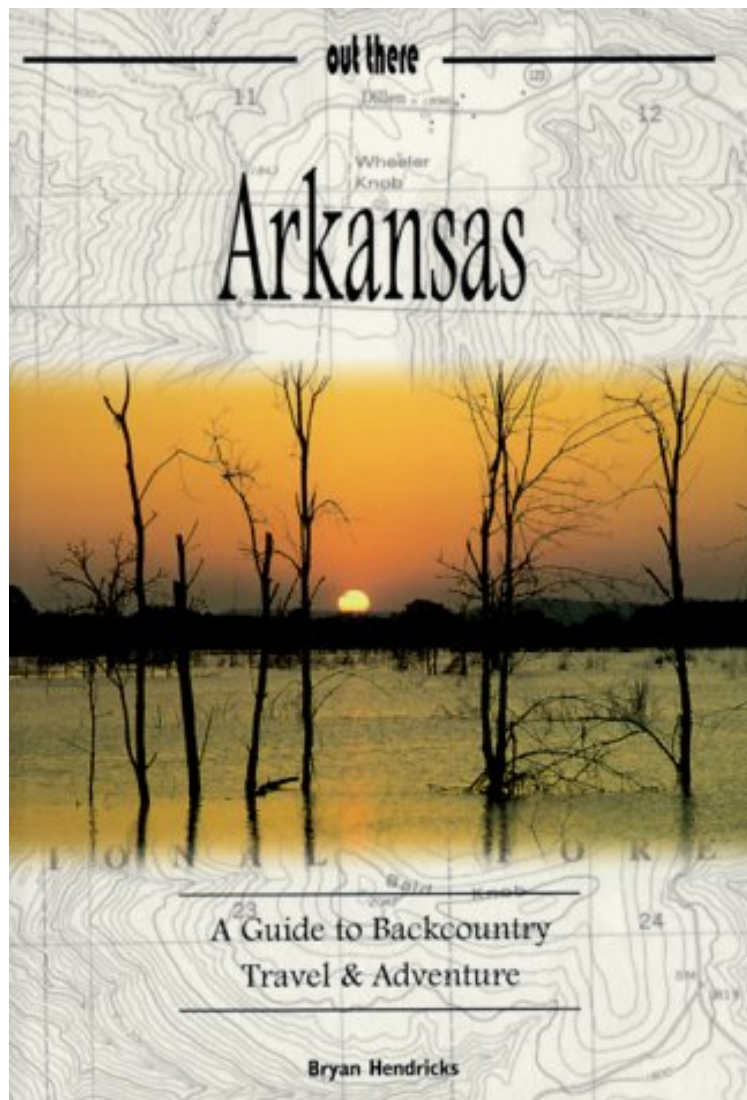

ThompsonArkansas: A Guide to Backcountry Travel Adventure, written by Bryan Hendricks, is in my opinion, by far the best book currently available for the outdoor enthusiast in Arkansas. After having purchased and/or read several titles of this genre, Mr. Hendricks' book provides the most complete and objective overviews of outdoor activities in every region of Arkansas. The maps are accurate and easy to read, as are the descriptions of services available and activities permitted by state and local laws. As a father of three young children, it is important that when we travel, I have the most accurate and up to date information about our destination as is possible. I trust Mr. Hendricks' evaluations as listed in his book, as I have already visited several of the featured areas and have found his appraisals honest and observant. I am an avid mountain bicyclist, and I have found it difficult to find reliable information about sanctioned places outside my immediate locality in which I can ride. Most others books on the market woefully ignore mountain biking as a legitimate sport, while Mr. Hendricks gives it equal billing with more conventional pastimes such as camping, hiking, boating, and fishing (which I also enjoy immensely). I have noticed a trend in which authors write books about their "favorite" or "the best" place(s) to go in Arkansas. This is fine, but I've found that my family's taste differs from the offerings in these books, and we are often disappointed in the end. "Arkansas: A Backcountry Guide to Travel Adventure" has more information on more natural habitats in Arkansas than the previously mentioned types of books, and also offers subjective commentary about each of these locations. Each area is described in detail, including contact information, directions to get there, the topography of the area, allowed activities, and the particular "do and do not's" of the site. I will conclude this by saying that as a native Arkansawyer myself, this book has really opened up my options for outdoor recreation, and I'm sure that anyone purchasing this title will not be disappointed.6 of 6 people found the following review helpful. CustomerArkansas, A Guide to Backcountry Travel Adventure, is the most comprehensive resource for adventure travel in Arkansas ever written. In fact, it sets a new standard for all books of this genre. Unlike many guide books, which are informative but very dry, Arkansas ... is fast-paced and very entertaining. It covers about 120 different areas across the state and details the opportunities each offers in terms of camping, hiking, fishing, mountain biking, canoeing/kayaking and rock climbing. It lists locations of individual trailheads and river/lake access points. It also explains directions to each area to within 1/10 of a mile. In the "camping" sections, it describes each campground and lists total number of campsites, whether running water and showers are present and describes campsite amenities, such as picnic tables, lantern posts, fire rings, etc. The introductions to each area really make this book shine. They contain colorful snippets of local lore and history, and Hendricks' descriptions make you feel as if you're really there. If I found a fault with this book, it's that the introductions weren't longer. Although the chapters concerning the Ozark and Ouachita Mountains were excellent and remarkably complete, I really enjoyed the sections dealing with the Mississippi River Delta and the Gulf Coastal Plain. As Hendricks explained in the introduction, "Before its inclusion in this book, the Delta was uncharted territory for backcountry travelers." If you want information on these areas, this book is the only place you'll find it. Because it covers so much territory, Arkansas ... is more of an access guide, so it doesn't give step-by-step descriptions of individual trails or waterways. Hendricks provides just enough information to make you hungry for more. Otherwise, the entries for the individual activities are packed with information.
