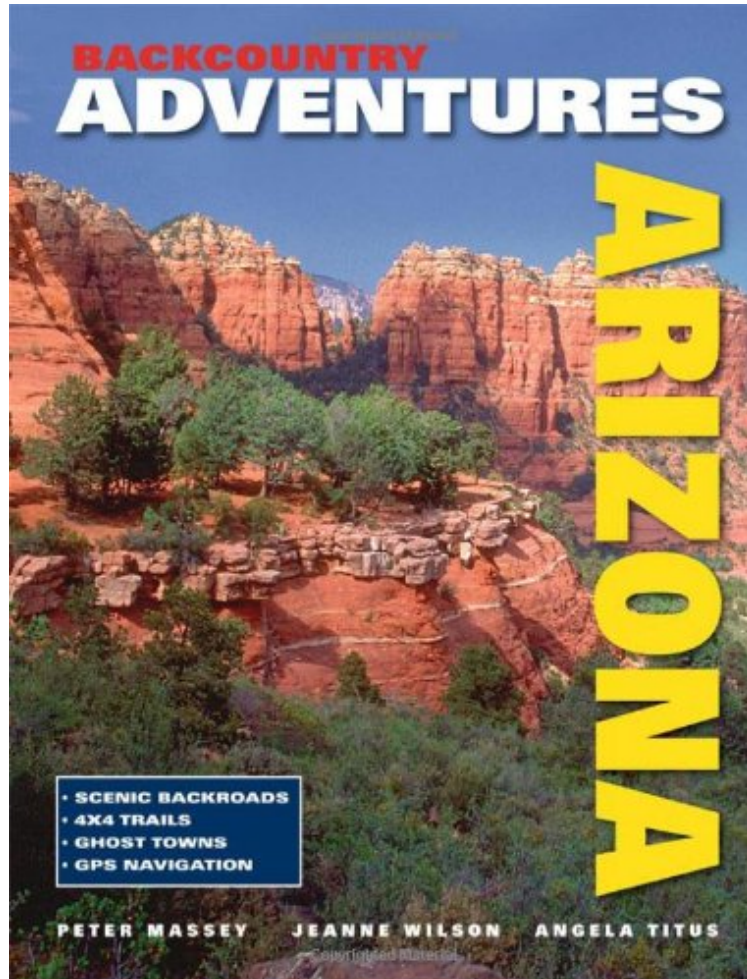

Divided into 4 sections of AZ which makes it easy to find the section of the state that you want to explore. Plenty of trail descriptions and GPS for those who want to use it. As a bonus there is a good history of the areas and a section of some of the flora and fauna that one might encounter. This book covers about 150 of the best AZ trails and back country adventures so there may be more remote and less known roads that might be covered in a book like Guide to Arizona Backroads 4- Wheel Drive Trails by Charles Wells. My son has it in soft

cover and we have used it on a number of 4x4 outings. The GPS coordinates are good and descriptions accurate. Occasionally it is difficult to determine which fork to take but that is rare.
