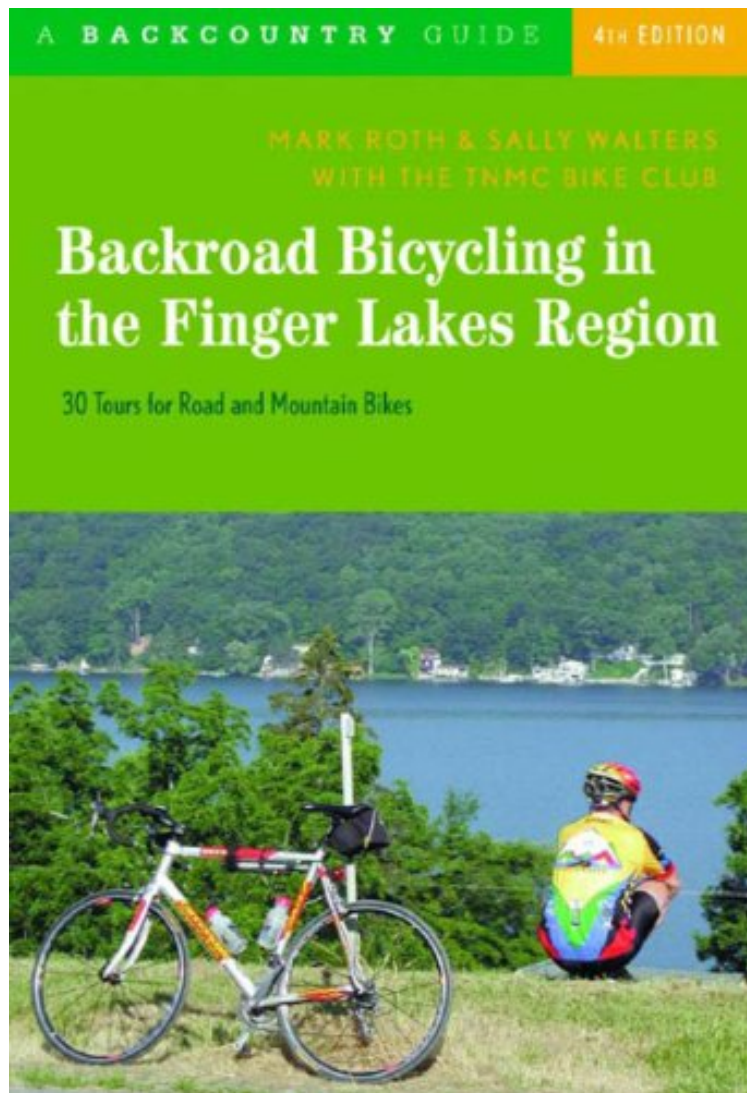

By JThe strength of this book lies in its descriptions and history of the sites visited. The suggested areas for touring are also spread over a very wide area, which is good, since it is unlikely that one would plan to do all the tours in one visit. The routes follow main roads, and I discovered much more picturesque and cycling-friendly roads by modifying the routes suggested (e.g. shore-hugging East Lake Rd rather than Rt 54 along the eastern side of Keuka Lake (pg 181-183)). If one is strictly interested in routes without history, there are free resources available thru the local bicycling club and internet mapping applications.
