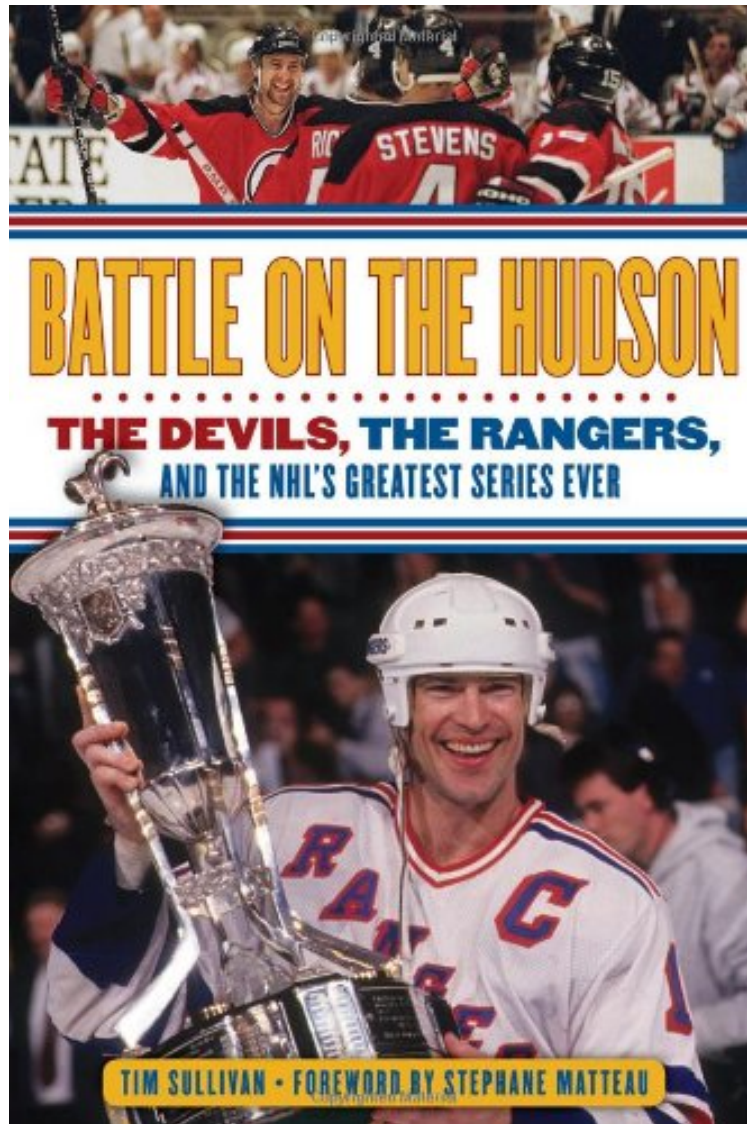

There was the Keenan/Neil Smith war all through the season. There were stories of dissension among the Devils. Many of these things were documented after the series. Sullivan sees none of these stories and certainly tells none. He does a terrible job in giving you a feel of the "inside" story. Everybody respects everybody else. This one is great, that one is great. The coaches are great. He does a TERRIBLE job quoting various sportwriters who covered the series. For example, Larry Brooks is a caustic, opinionated and fantastic hockey writer. He makes Brooks look like a rah-rah guy without a shred of objectivity. This series propelled the devils to three cups and five finals appearances, and being 14 at the time of the series, this was a great blow-by-blow recap of this wonderful series. I learned some things about both teams that I missed as a high school freshman, and that's all I was hoping for with this book. The interviews are really great, as all of the key figures are here with the exception of messier and lemaire. The only thing that bothered me were the references to brodeur as a butterfly goalie, as he is anything but. Overall, a very fun read!
