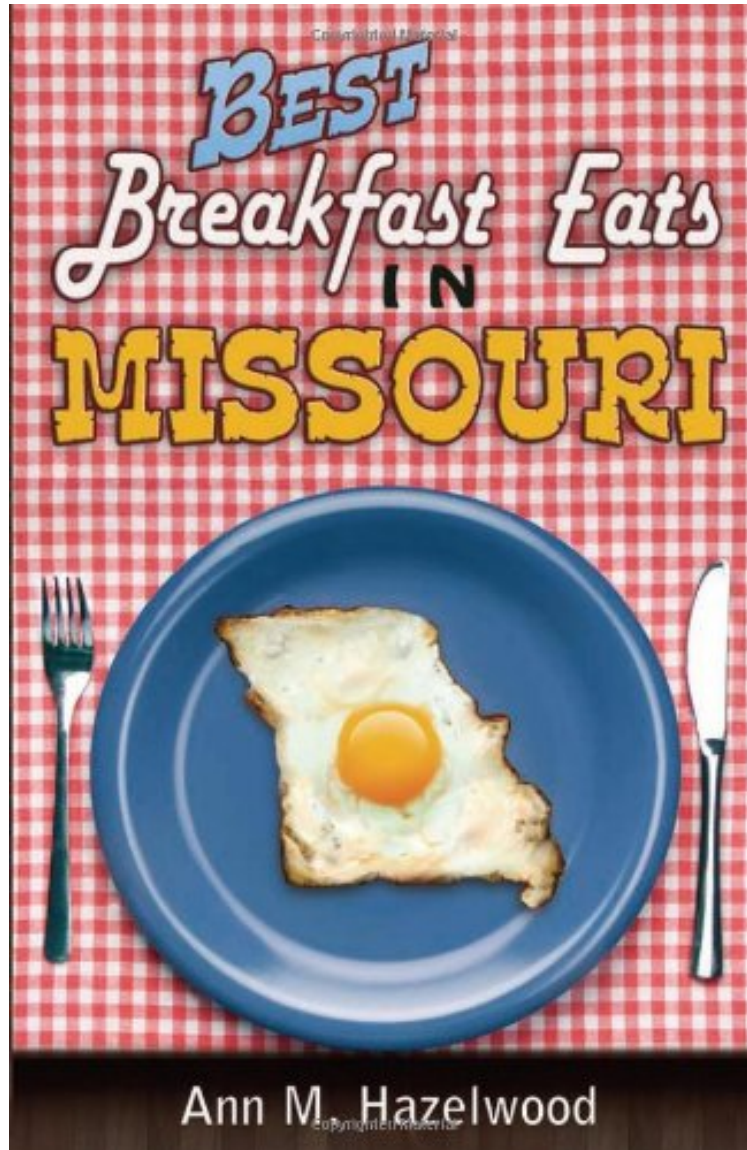

we find Ann M. Hazelwood's recent book, *Best Breakfast Eats in Missouri* and are pleased to review it. Hazelwood starts the book with her 10-point criteria for her chosen breakfast places. These run from quality of service, eight areas of mandatory homemade items (no waffle mixes, please), seating comfort and generally pleasing atmosphere. She also sets out a 12-item expectation list for brunches. She concentrates on five Missouri areas and as many recipes. We counted 74 breakfast places, in all. We weren't able to accompany Hazelwood on her fact-gathering missions, but from page turning, we selected some we like mostly because we like "healthy" and innovation: SOULARD GARDEN AND CAF, ST. LOUIS, because they make waffles with cornmeal and serve fresh blueberries and lemon hollandaise. LEWIS CAF, ST. CLAIR, as they are known for the sausage they make from the entire pig, and some of it is served as Poppy Seed Celery Dressing. COMPANION, CLAYTON, for their two-inch-high Baked Eggs and Smoked Salmon with Bagels. WILLOW HOUSE BED AND BREAKFAST, PERRYVILLE, because they serve Baked Eggs in Puff Pastry. They also make Rosemary-Infused Syrup. HUNGRY HOUSE, SARCOXIE, has their Belly Buster which is layered biscuits, eggs, hash browns, peppers, onions, bacon and sausage under gravy. ON THE RISE BAKERY AND WOOD FIRED BISTRO, OSAGE BEACH, for their Benedicts, especially their Californian with turkey, artichoke hearts and caramelized onions. MISSOURI MUD COMPANY GREEK DELI AND COFFEE HOUSE, RAYMORE, for George's Greek Omelet and Cappuccino Fudge Muffins. BROADWAY DINER, COLUMBIA, for their great big Stretch, thick-cut bacon and Trippleberry Pancake. Ciao! Breakfast's important.

The most important meal of the day is taken seriously in the Show Me State. Just ask Missouri author Ann M. Hazelwood, who spent more than a year seeking places in Missouri that do breakfast best. She compiles her findings in *Best Breakfast Eats in Missouri*, a book that features everything from popular brunch destinations, to bed and breakfasts, to neighborhood diners. Discover gems like Lady Di's Tea Room in St. Charles, which offers a 13-egg omelet; drop by Aunt Martha's Pancake House in Springfield for a delicious chocolate pancake with a scoop of ice cream; bring the whole family to Pumpernickles Deli in St. Louis for matzo and eggs or challah French toast; and when you're in Cottleville pull up a chair to the five-course brunch at Stone Soup Cottage. You don't want to skip breakfast. Don't skip *Best Breakfast Eats in Missouri*!
