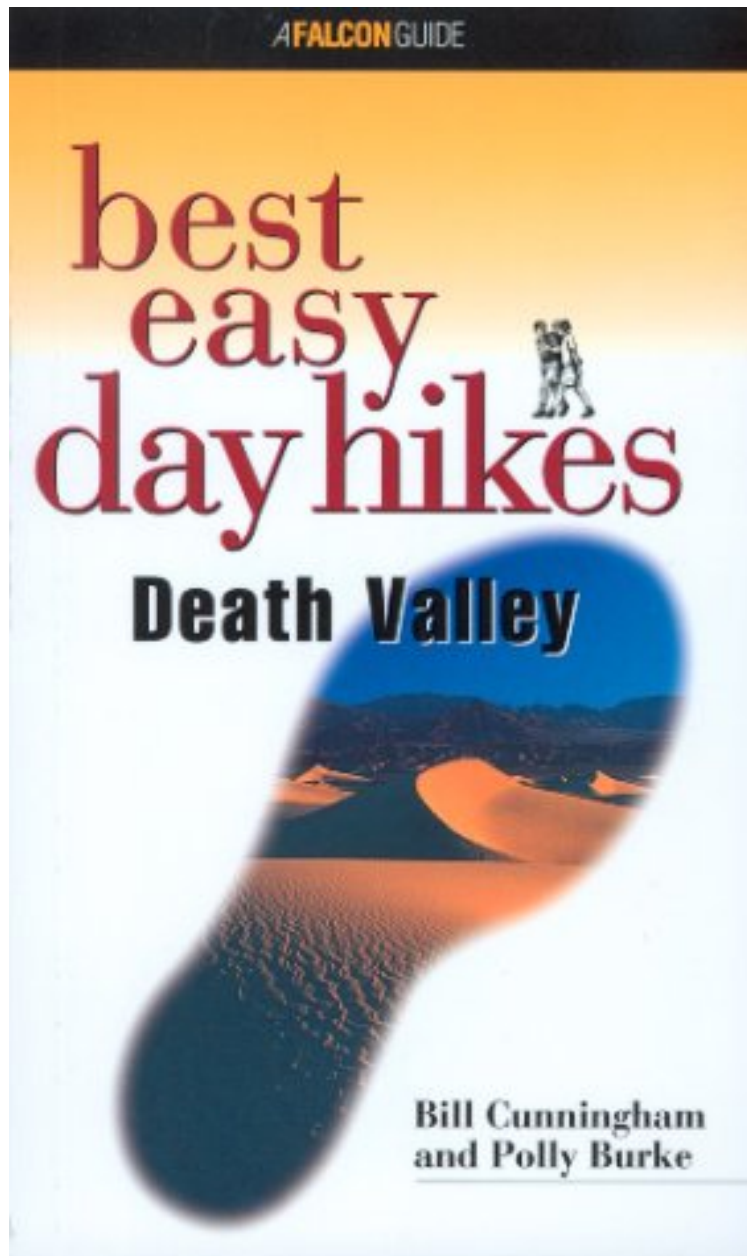


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## Best Easy Day Hikes Death Valley (Best Easy Day Hikes Series)

It goes well with the all-important Death Valley National Park, CA - Trails Illustrated Map #221 (Ti - National Parks). Alas, like all these Falcon day hike guides, it lacks a features key for a quick overview of options, though that is less of a drawback in Death Valley NP where the distances are so long, you're going hiking where your car is going; and there's not so much question about a hidden waterfall on Trail A and a panoramic view on Trail B. You'll see desert and mountains, near or far, most anywhere in the park, I imagine (and I am not complaining!).
