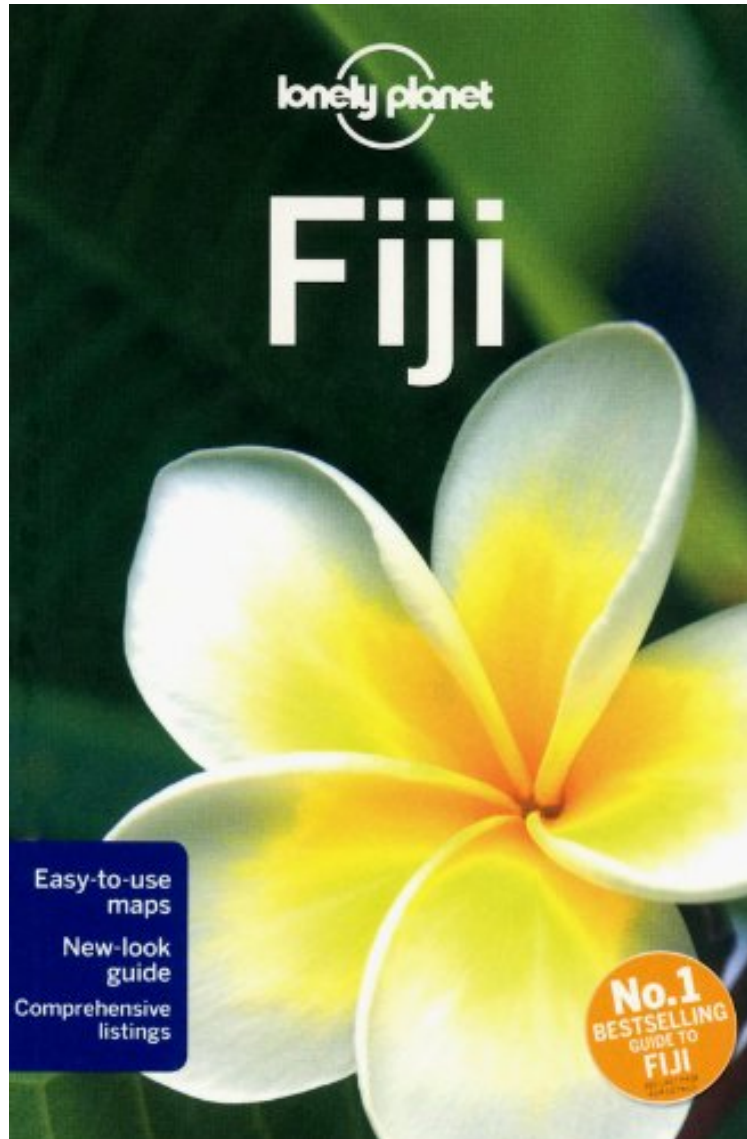

I only saw the 2.5 hour bus to Suva, which would have taken too much time for our time there. As many (most?) visitors don't venture much out of the Nadi/Denarau area, a version of the book with emphasis on that area would be more useful.
