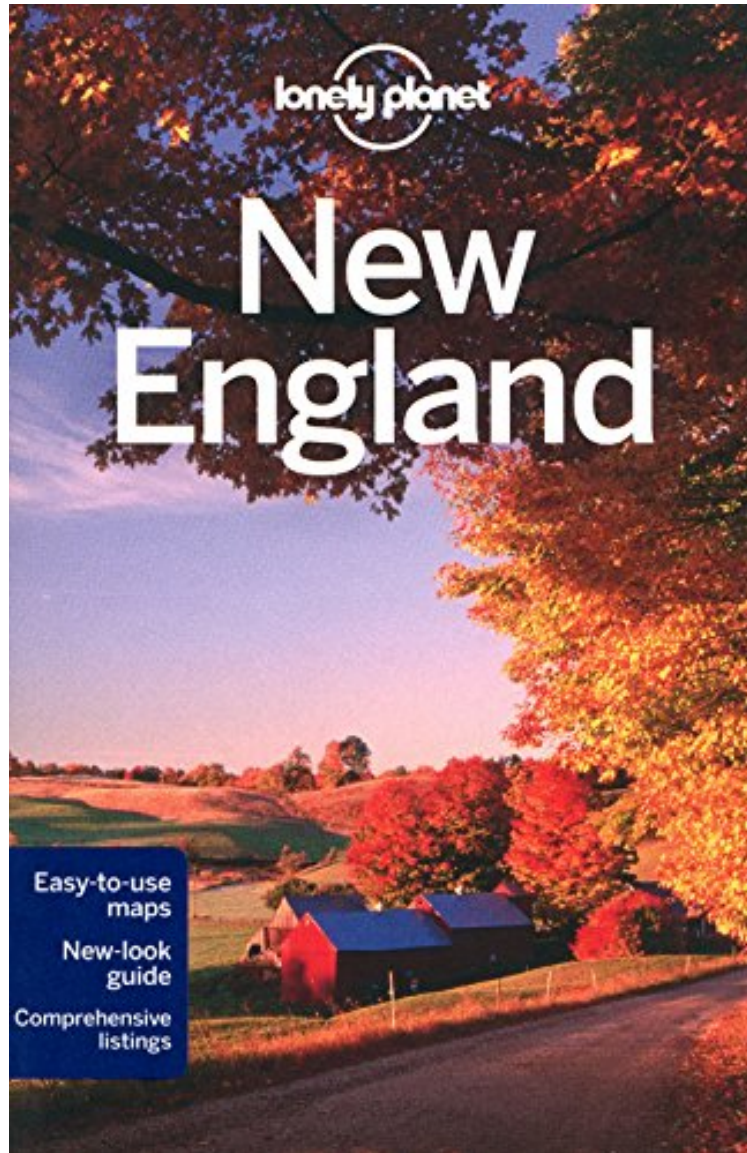

I bought the book for a few places I was visiting in Vermont, not all of which were in the book and those that were covered were not given a great deal of coverage. For what it tries to do, the book succeeds I suppose.
