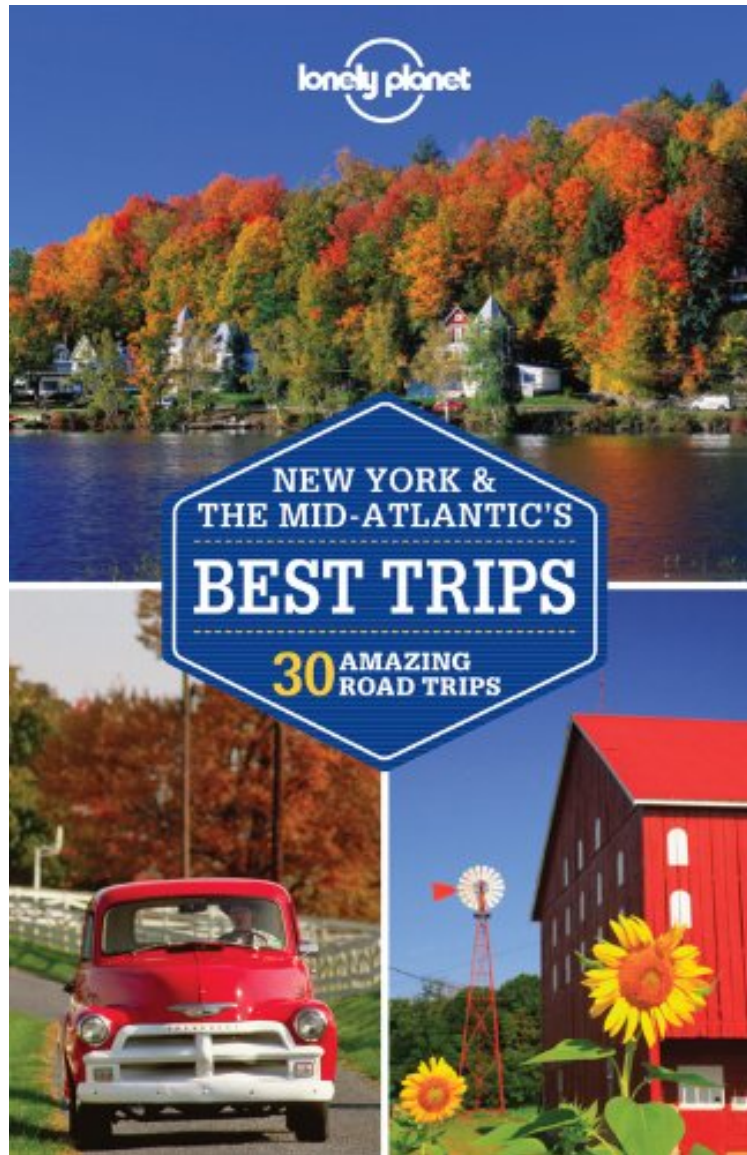

Kindle edition of this book for my Android tablet, for an upcoming trip. Unfortunately, it's almost impossible to navigate. There are no active links in the book at all. The table of contents consists of 340 separate page links, labeled "Page 1", "Page 2", etc., with no mention of book sections or the individual 27 trips. If you're reading the book and come across a reference to a museum that says, "See trip 7", for example, you have to return to the beginning of the book, find the page number of Trip 7, and then scroll through the page numbers in the so-called table of contents. Then you have to page through Trip 7 until you find what you're looking for. On my Kindle, it was even worse. There is no table of contents at all. The only way to navigate through the book is by "Page up" and "Page down". Many of the graphics are chopped in half. (I've attached a photo, which is sideways, and I don't see any way to rotate it, so turn your head 90 degrees.) For a guide book, it's useless. shouldn't even offer this book in Kindle format. The content itself is very mixed. The section about the Pennsylvania Dutch country points you to the most tacky touristy places in the area. As a book of road trips, it could have highlighted some of the charming country roads, covered bridges, farmers markets, or craft shops rather than Dutch Eats places where tour buses disgorge hundreds of people. There were also gross inaccuracies about the Amish community. The other trips are likewise superficial and lacking in important detail. The recommendations for places to eat and lodge are scanty and don't show any effort. They could have been pulled from the Yellow Pages. Philadelphia appears under at least three different trips. It may appear in more places, but given the difficulty of navigating the book, I haven't tried to find all of them. For our planned trip to Philadelphia, it's not useful. The best trips of those I read were the Route 6 trip, in Pennsylvania, and the Down the Delaware trip. However, even these are superficial and lacking in detail. For the formatting in Kindle version, I would give the book no stars at all. The two stars are for the content.
