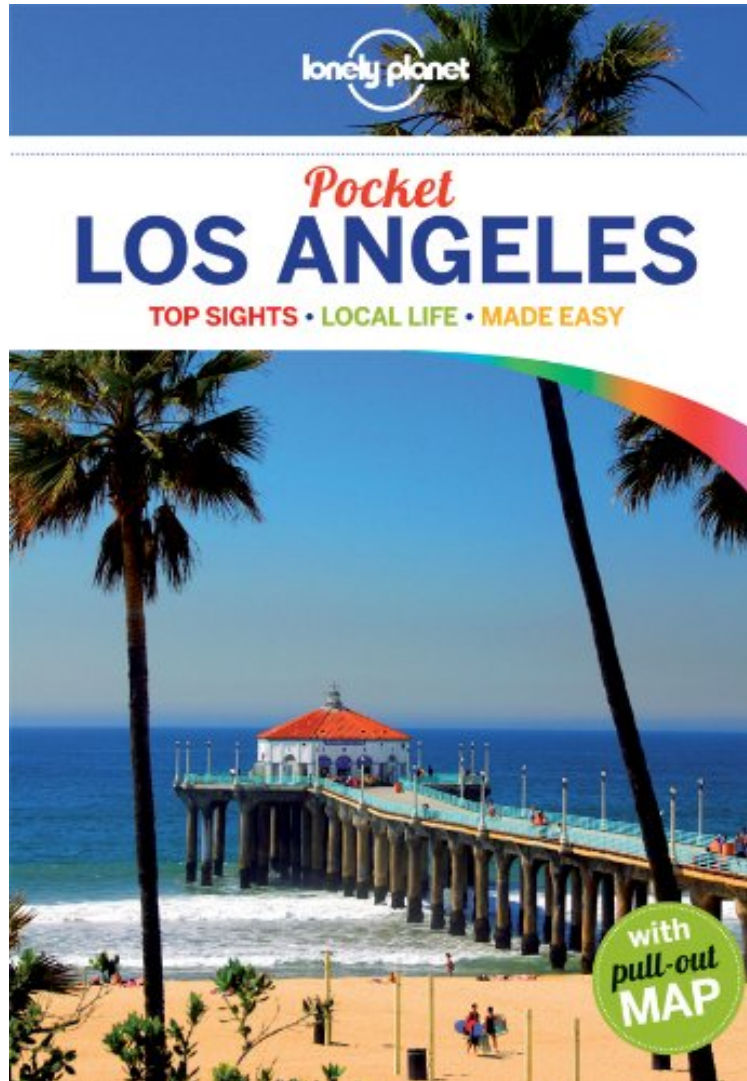

Ideal for, say, if you have a one-day layover or are spending a weekend. In the case of the Los Angeles guide, I had about a day and a half. I like them because I can get straight to the heart of the key things to see and do in a short timeframe. They aren't good for extensive advance planning (I rely on internet research or other research at home for that). They are nice and compact...with a pullout map. The map in my experience is useful, but could be more so. Often, the detail is too

minimal to be truly great. Again, got a smartphone, so it's not the be all end all, but is handy for a reference. I will, however, in the future, plan enough in advance to get a paper version. What I loved about it--small, handy size, pull out map, easy reference, was a little negated by reading on my kindle (or, in this case, kindle app on my phone). I don't know about you, but my phone drains of battery constantly while traveling--between using as a camera, GPS, phone, guidebook, etc...so, it's nice to have something that I can flip through.
