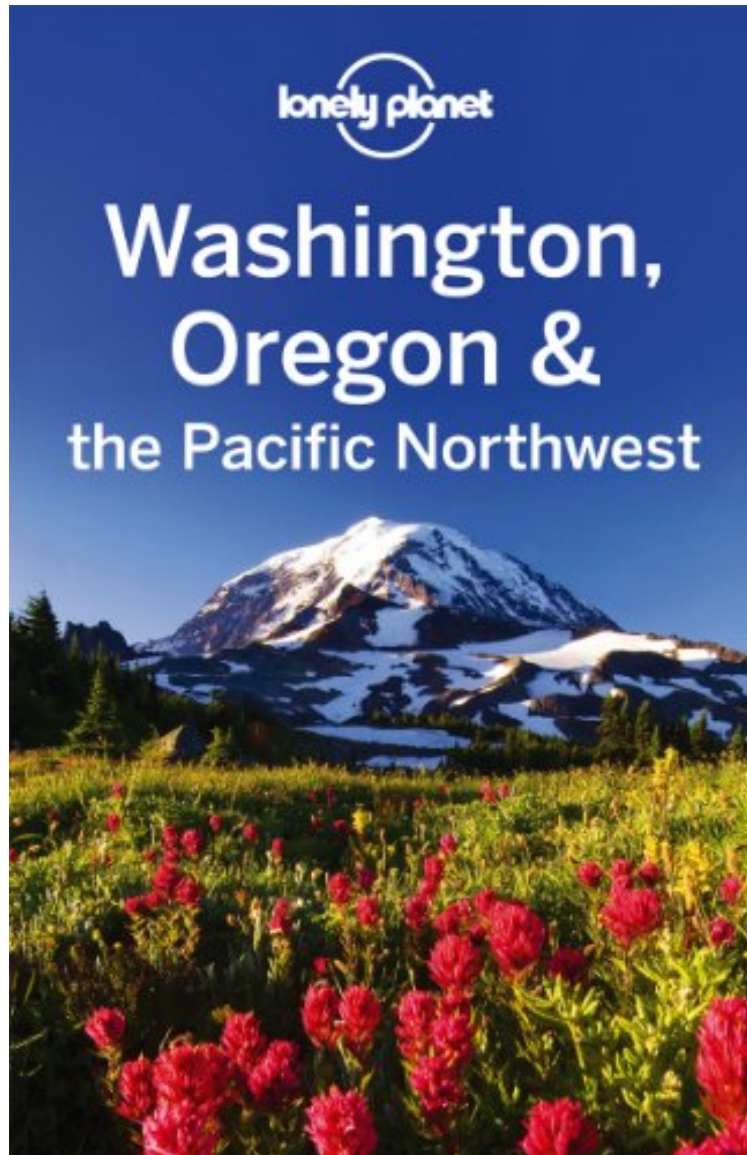

It covers the U.S. states of Oregon and Washington, along with Canada's Vancouver and Vancouver Island. The format is geared to readers who want their information quickly, in bite-sized chunks with maps and graphics. The guide has only a handful of pictures, but it does make a good effort to sort the attractions of the Pacific Northwest to appeal to a variety of reader tastes and interests, from the seashore to outdoor recreation to micro-breweries to traveling with children.Readers may find the geographic breakdown of the guide to be especially useful. Oregon has seven sections, Washington has five, and the Canadian corner has two more. This breakout allows for a more nuanced approach to large but distinctive regions such as the cities of Portland and Seattle, the Willamette Valley, and Vancouver Island.
