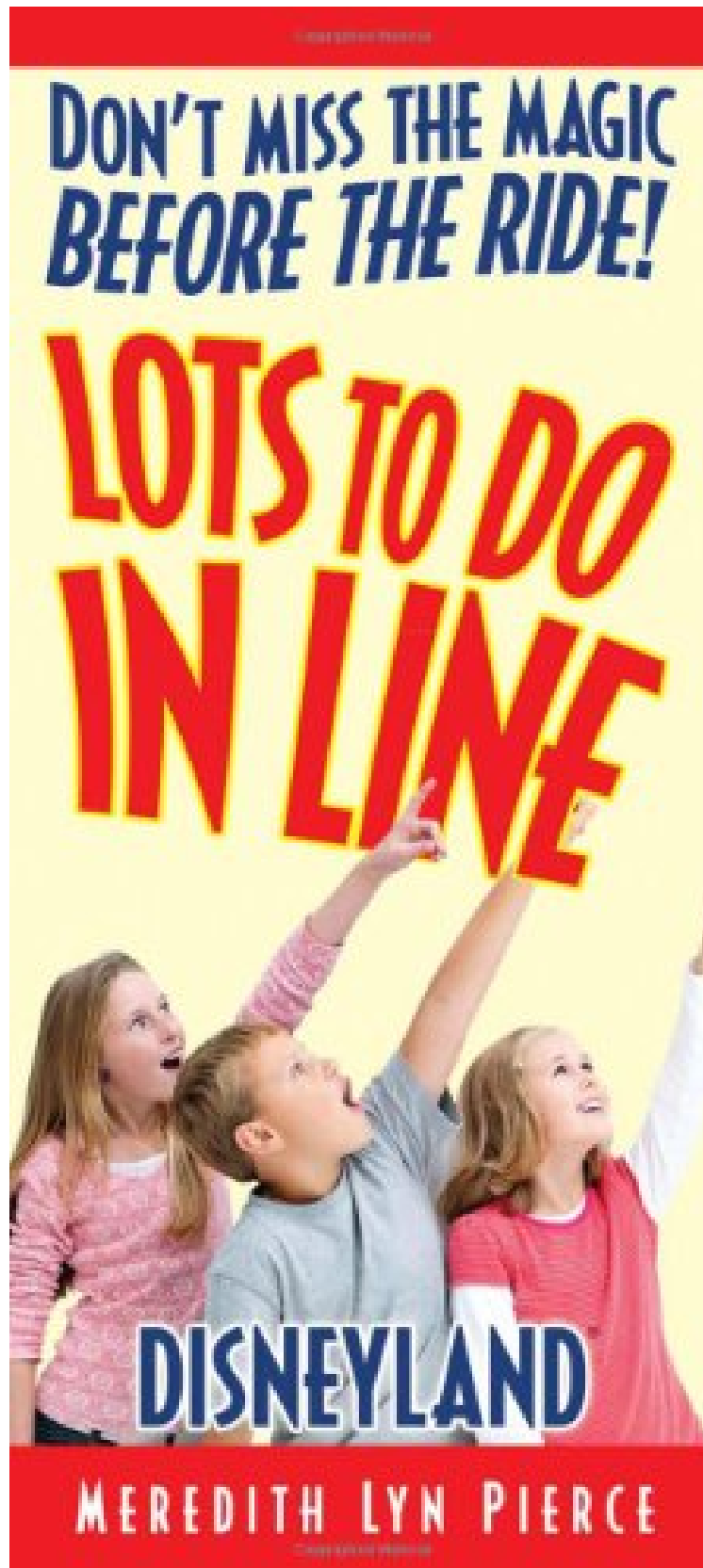

Our favorite parts were the true "scavenger hunt" sections - like in Toon Town, where the book encourages you to walk around a wonderfully themed area and search for all the little details you might otherwise miss.We used it with our 8 and 5 year old and it was perfect! I would institute a "chocolate covered banana challenge" and make the kids find all of the answers for the next three rides and if they did, they got a chocolate covered banana! Next was the "churro challenge"... you get the picture... The kids LOVED this. It kept them busy and motivated and before we knew it we were on the ride and they were munching on their churros. We did one or two challenges a day and that would be their daily treat.It is relatively small and compact, which is completely necessary since you have to bring it around with you. A kindle version of this book would be great!I did find a few editing errors and since Disneyland is always changing, it can't be 100% up to date, so you need to know that before you buy.
