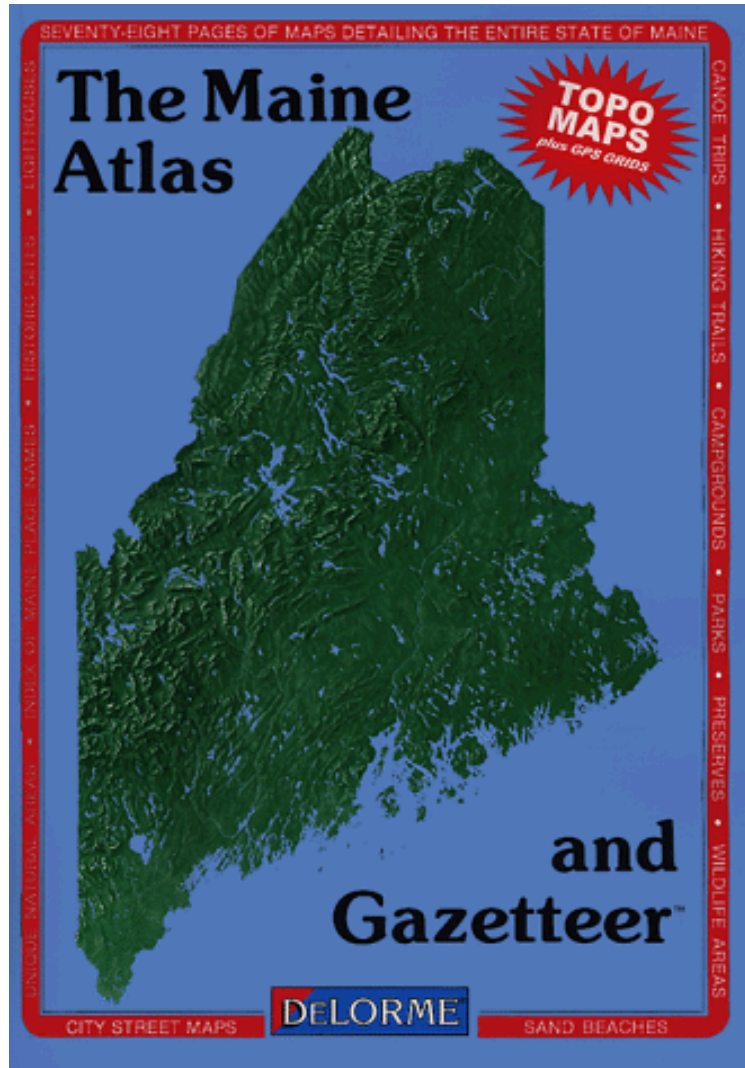

This atlas follows the usual DeLorme format, with a couple of big maps of the whole state; an index of place names; a listing of parks, campgrounds, and recreation areas; a map of all the townships in the state; and grid maps of the entire state. The back end of the atlas has close-up maps of the major population centers. The grid maps are in color and include height contour lines. The state has a surprising variety of nature reserves and public lands available for recreational use.
