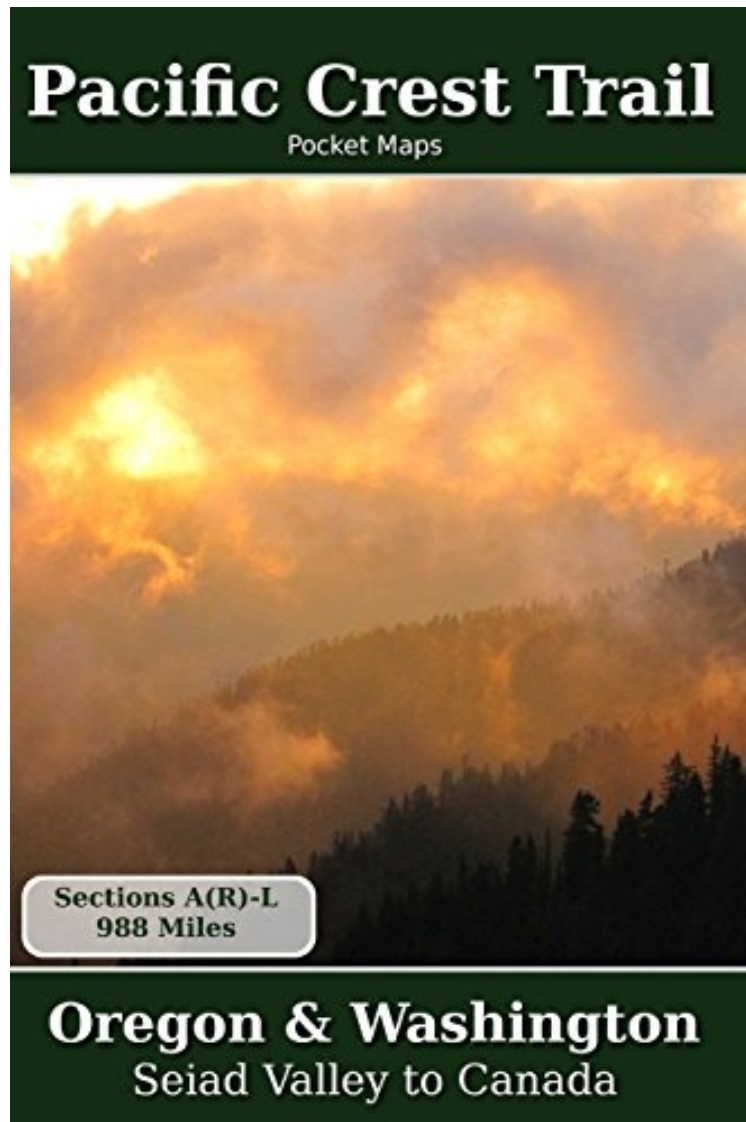

Poor and hard to readBy Philips PattonI got used to the great trail maps available on the Appalachian Trail and was looking for the Pacific Crest equivalent; I ordered this booklet to check it out. -Not- what I was looking for! The book contains probably a hundred small maps, such that the scale is pretty detailed - but printed in a booklet like this it ends up being both a bit thick/heavy (and not waterproof!) - as well as, conversely, each map appearing tiny cramped, hard to read and confusing on the eye, and what's worse, sort of

lacking the greater context. There's tiny infocharts that tell you a town is off this way 4.5 miles, but overall these are barebones, hand-made maps. I feel like I could've done better with Google Maps in Terrain mode and the PCT plugin. The Appalachian Trail Conservancy maps were always fold-out, and waterproof and they had very nice elevation charts running along the bottom. In addition, because each AT map covers a wide, contiguous area, you get the overall feel of what the next section is going to be like - and can actually see the towns and plan alternative routes into them. I haven't actually hiked the PCT with this book, but I don't plan to, as looking at them is unpleasant and seemingly not that informative. Further research on the web came up with: Eric The Black's guides, which appear head and shoulders above this one, and free digital maps from "Halfmile." Check those two options out instead!
