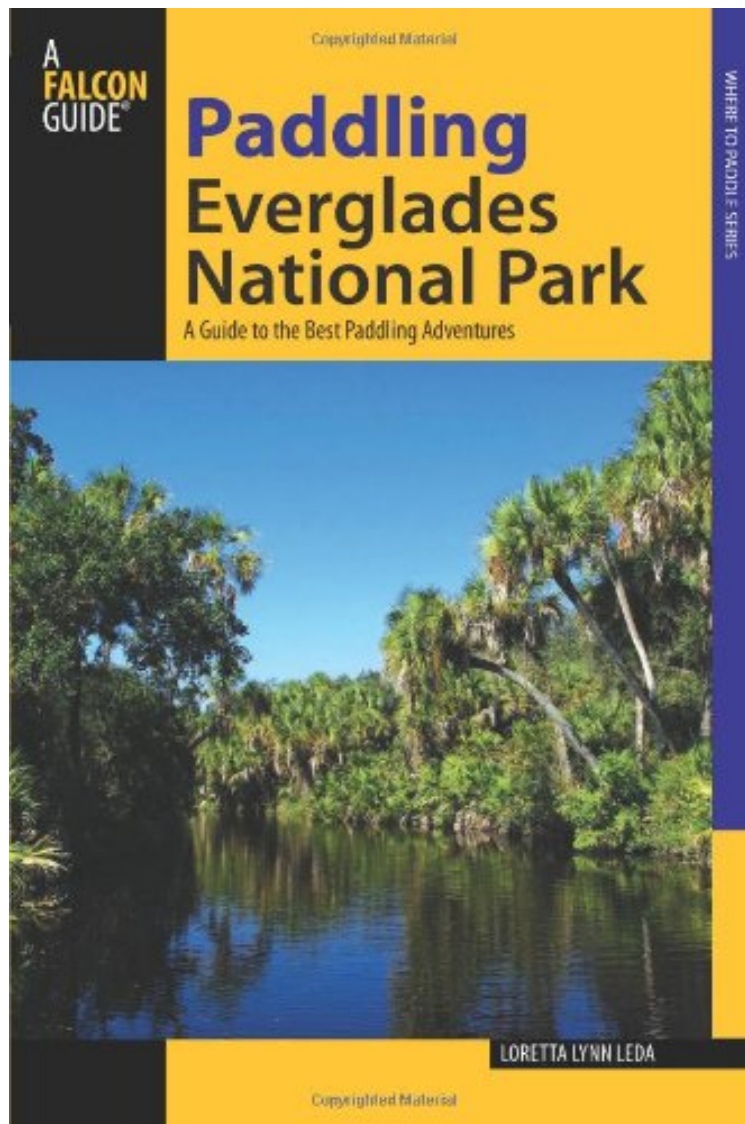

She does not know about camp sites, birds, regulations, or what wildlife you will encounter. The maps WILL get you lost and confused she uses names used by some and not most. she fabricates history, the distances of routes are wrong, she speaks of "shuttles", confuses terminology, and makes many careless errors. The book is new but many facts are out of date by years! she even attempts to give directions by vaguely describing MANGROVES. This book is highly flawed and the publisher should be ashamed for not doing the slightest fact checking DO NOT WASTE YOUR TIME OR MONEY!!!
