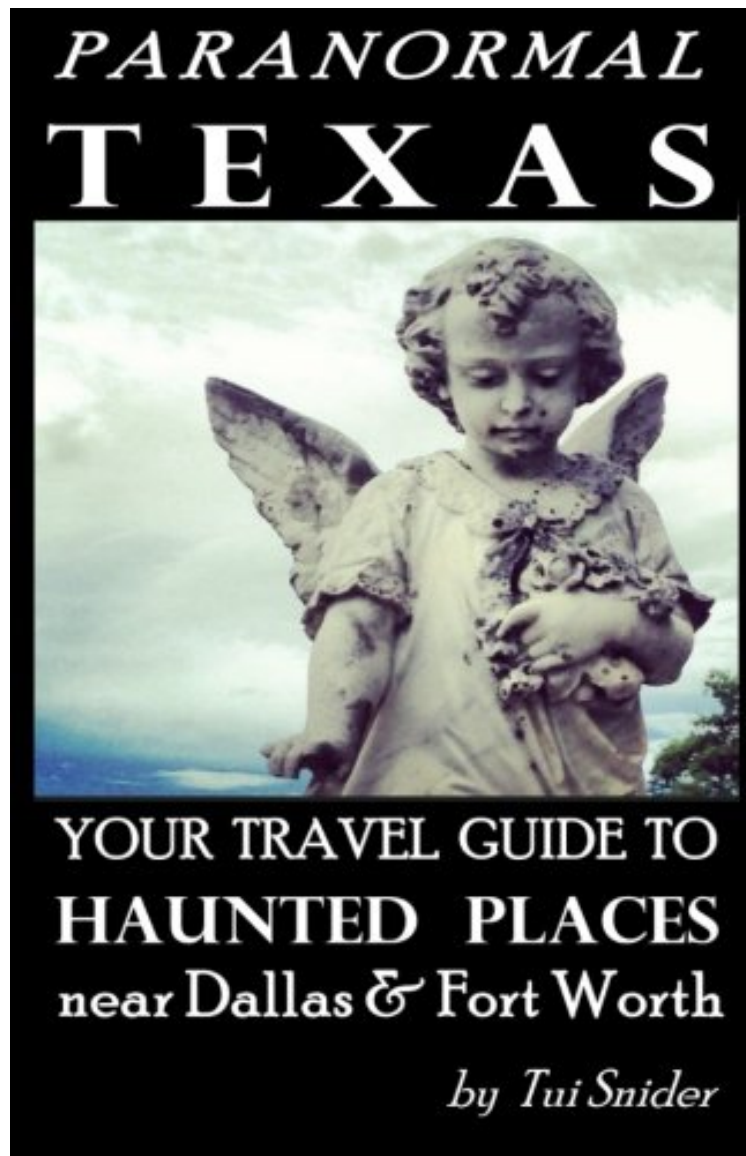

What is especially helpful in this book is the detailed background that includes what to do but also what NOT to do when you visit some of these sites. The etiquette of paranormal visitations were very enlightening as was the glossary of terms for those not familiar with paranormal phenomena.
