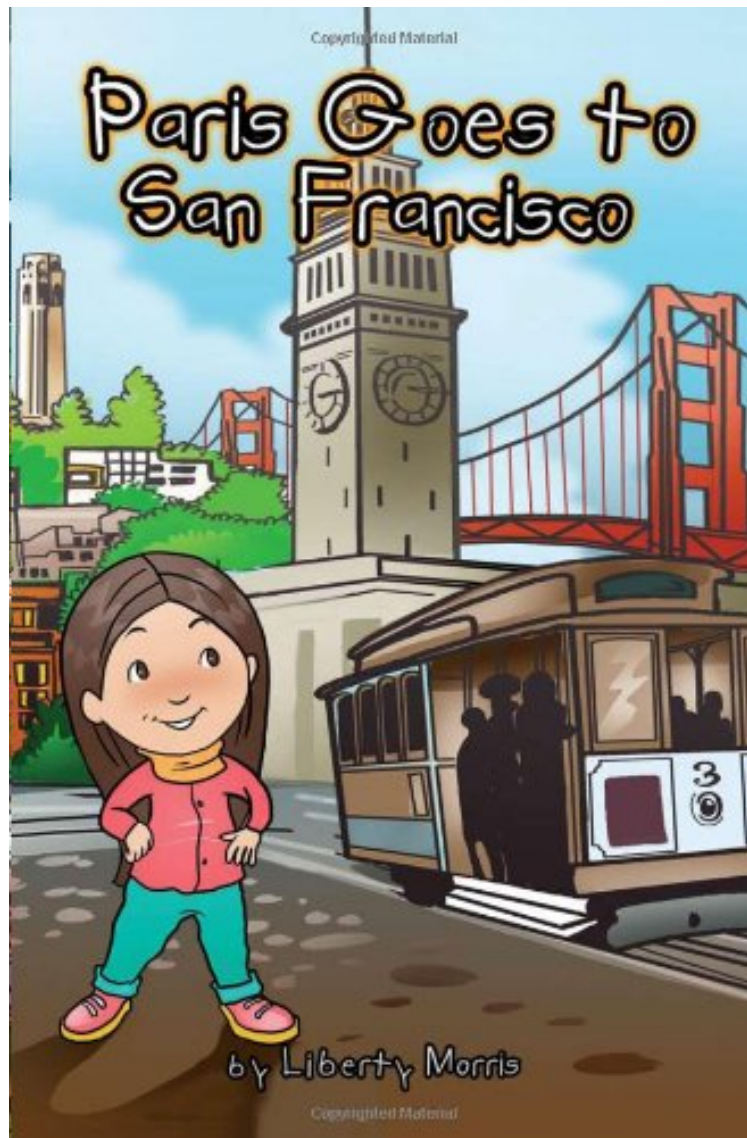

The illustrations, done by a young teen artist, are complex and interesting and full of lively colors and detail. And the storyline covers the high points of many people's visits to San Francisco with the realistic, in-the-moment thoughts

young tourists might have: that Alcatraz is a bit spooky, that cable cars sound like music, even that Dad's breath smells bad after he eats garlic fries. This Paris book lets the city speak for itself without trying to be a novel or make grand statements, with San Francisco's excitement in the foreground and the story in the background. Read it as a travel diary and focus on the sights and sounds of SF! I appreciated the mixture of well-known tourist destinations (AT T Park, Pier 39) with some more unique locations, such as the Chinatown New Year Parade and the Academy of Sciences. If I were to improve this book, I would expand upon it by including a few more interesting, but lesser-known and less obvious aspects of the city - perhaps the Paxton's Gate museum/shop near 826 Valencia, full of replicas of wildlife and pirate gear, or Hippie Hill in Golden Gate Park where kids play hackysack, or the art exhibits in the SF Library? Overall, great, simple, understandable concept, original artwork and layout, and consistent voice. Paris really sounds like a young girl talking about her day, in her own words.
