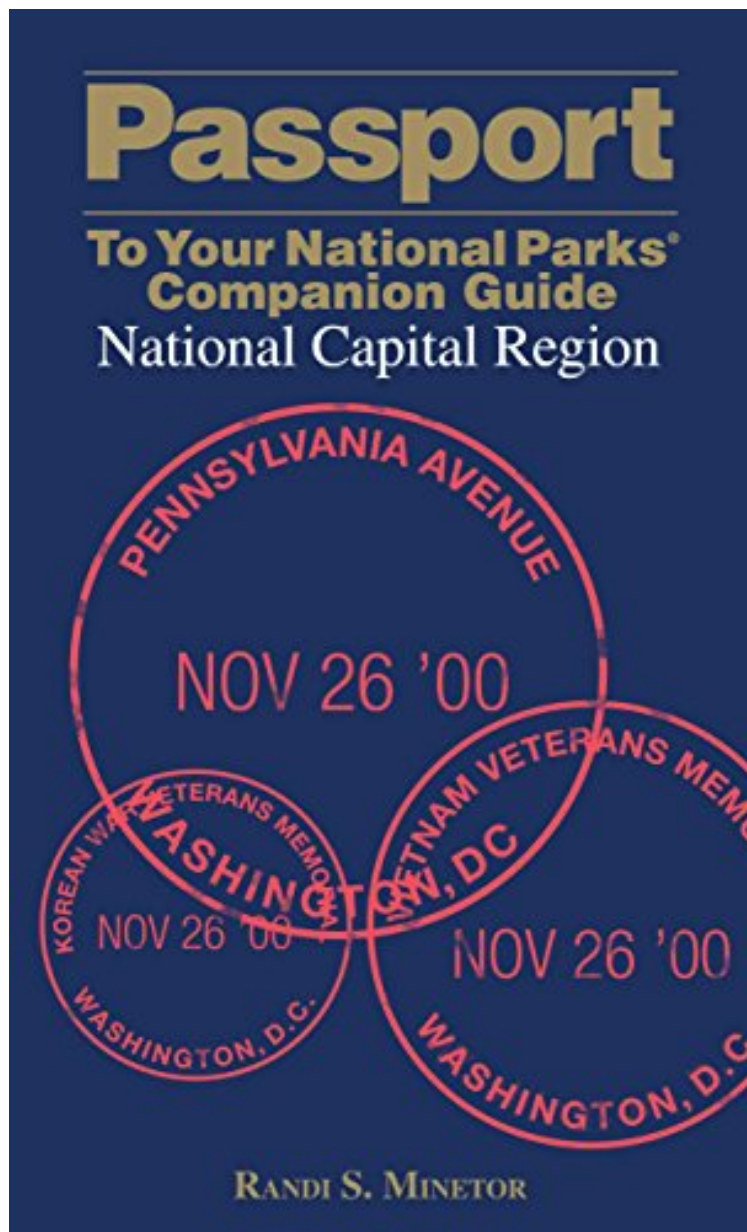

Be forewarned, it does not include stamping areas like the typical National Parks books, so we've just been stamping away on the edges of the pages. Most places have enough space to stamp at the end of each area, but there are a few that haven't had much and require some text overlap. Always make sure to check the places that you plan on visiting; some, like the Old Post Office, are closed for repair right now.
