CheneyPedro Vial was Pierre Vial, a native of Lyons, France. He was on the Missouri River in the Americas before the Revolutionary War. He first appears in the Southwest in 1786 as an explorer who was sent to open a trail from San Antonio to Santa Fe. He was no ordinary guide in those early days. He lived a tortured life of being exposed to constant dangers, developing languages and dialects to deal with Indians, and never receiving much money or prestige for all his valor and abilities. Vial died in Santa Fe in 1814 and was buried there. The book is the details of his treks and his relationships. Some individuals in the Spanish hierarchy saw the possibilities of the Western Hemisphere for long-time bases, but Spain officially had a more immediate view: a vision of gold, silver, furs and taxes. So there evolved a massive structure designed to rule the New World--not with the objective of putting anything permanent into it, but in such a manner as to get the most out
