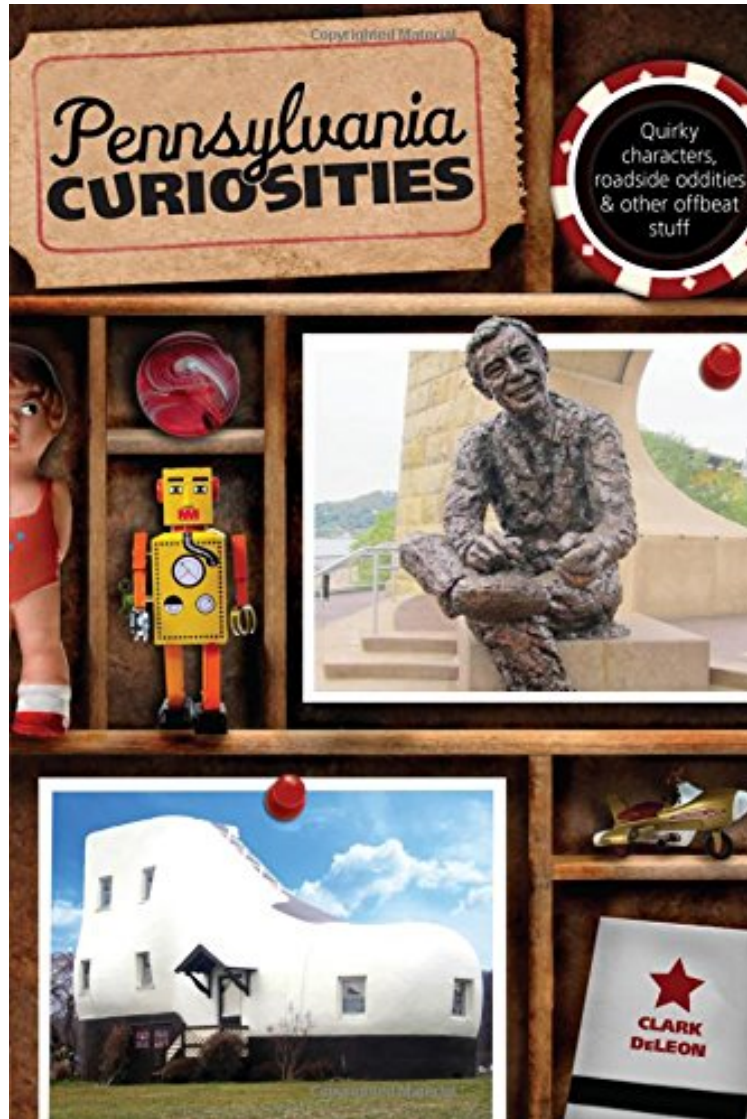

DeLeon was a Philly guy through and through and knew the Philly neighborhoods. By reading his column I lived through the

birth of his daughter, Molly, and other life changes he had. DeLeon is back writing for the Inky but only a monthly piece on the Op-Ed page (and hidden in the Opinion section rather than on the front page of the Local News. But Im digressing. Molly is now 23 years old and DeLeon is still telling her story, only this time its their travels around Pennsylvania both the DeLeons and my home state and discovering Pennsylvanias Curiosities. Though this is the fourth edition of DeLeons book, it is the first one Ive read. And I love it. Yes, Ive, been to some of the places he writes about Eastern States Penitentiary, Ben Franklins grave in Christ Church Burial Ground and the Rocky statute at the foot of the Art Museum. But though a walk by the tall Comcast Center Building on a regular basis, Ive not had the chance to actually see the small statute of William Penn on its roof. In this book DeLeon takes me there as well as places across the state that would take me eight, or more, hours to get to. And he does it in his own person writing style so that you feel you are right along with him. If you are a Pennsylvania, you need this book. Youll discover new places that just might be in your neighborhood or, possibly across the state. If you arent a Pennsylvania, youll still love this book. Theres lots of neat historical facts here but not presented in a boring way.
